Endangered Species Advisory Committee

Serving the Community -Service Standards Committee 46th Monitoring Report

Purpose

To inform members of the performance of the Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department (AFCD) in meeting its pledges with respect to the licensing of endangered animals and plants under the "Serving the Community" Scheme.

Background

2. AFCD published its first Performance Pledge on 1 August 1993. The current Performance Pledge was published in April 2008. The Performance Pledge provides information on the services available from the Department and sets out the performance standards and targets which the Department aims to achieve in respect of twenty of its more popular services.

Monitoring Mechanism

3. To monitor the performance of the Department in achieving its various published standards and targets, a Service Standards Committee was set up. The Committee, chaired by the Deputy Director and comprising six other members drawn from the various divisions of the Department, reviews the results of the performance submitted by the various divisions of the Department on a quarterly basis and reports the findings to the different advisory committees according to their respective areas of interest.

Performance Results

4. The performance results for the quarter ending September 2019, December 2019, March 2020, June 2020, September 2020, December 2020 and March 2021 with respect to the licensing of endangered animals and plants as summarised in the <u>Appendix</u> have been reviewed by the Service Standards Committee.

5. There were 25,378 applications in the seven quarters under review. Overall, 96.8% of the applications met the targets. During the review period, special work arrangement was implemented to limit the number of staff working in the office during the COVID-19 outbreak. Therefore, processing of some applications could not be completed

within the target turn-around time. Moreover, 10,183 applications were received in bulk and a longer processing time was needed.

Comments by Service Standards Committee

6. The Service Standards Committee was of the view that the overall results were satisfactory. The committee also noted that no complaint on the services provided by the Department was received during the periods covered by this report.

Advice Sought

7. Members are requested to comment on and endorse the findings of the Service Standards Committee.
