Country and Marine Parks Authority Progress Report (1.8.2021 – 31.12.2021)

Purpose

This paper aims to provide members a general overview on management and protection work conducted by the Country and Marine Parks Authority during the period between 1.8.2021 and 31.12.2021. It provides various figures and information for facilitating members to understand and offer advice to the Authority regarding the management of country and marine parks.

A. Country Parks & Special Areas

1. Country Parks Management

1.1 Management Services

Routine maintenance of all recreational facilities within county parks and special areas was carried out regularly for public enjoyment. Major country parks facilities provided and amount of refuse collected are shown below for reference.

1.4 Control of Development

2.3 Marine Parks Ambassador Scheme

The Marine Parks Ambassador Scheme has been commenced since August 2005. In light of the development of the COVID-19 epidemic, ambassador activities were suspended during the reporting period. Up to 31 Dec 2021, there are a total of 625 Marine Parks Ambassadors. During the report period, 11 ambassadors had participated in the 'Hoi Ha Festival' kick-off ceremony and coastal clean-up.

2.4 Education Programmes and Publicity

In light of the COVID-19 epidemic, all field studies and guided eco-tours for schools were suspended while school talks were changed to online format if there was any application. 3. Law Enforcement

A taskforce on sea enforcement work related to the Marine Parks Ordinance (Cap. 476) and Fisheries Protection Ordinance (Cap. 171) is established to enhance synergistic effect. During the report period, 2 illegal fishing incidents in Hong Kong waters involving 5 mainland fishermen were successfully prosecuted while an advisory letter was issued to a local fishing vessel owner. In addition, a total of 369 advices, one written warning and 11 verbal warnings were given in marine parks and marine reserve, and 5 suspected offense cases were under investigation.
