NOTES TO APPLICANT

- (1) Information should be written or typed in BLOCK LETTERS in English. (English, French and Spanish are CITES[#]'s official and working languages.)
- (2) Applicant shall apply a separate Licence to Possess for each keeping premises.
- (3) Photocopies of all supporting documents (e.g. Licence to Import or Supplier's Licence to Possess and invoices or documents showing all the transactions, etc.) should be submitted with the application.
- (4) Normally 2 working days will be required for processing an application. However, delays may be resulted if the application is incomplete or supporting documents are lacking. A longer processing time may be required if the application involves checking with other CITES[#] Management Authorities or the CITES[#] Secretariat, or inspection of the specimens or the keeping premises.
- (5) Appropriate fee will be charged for the issuance of a licence. For the latest licence fees, please refer to this department website <http://www.cites.hk/>.

2. The Director of Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department may cancel a licence if he is satisfied that the licence was issued as a result of false representation of any fact made by the applicant or an unlawful act of the applicant.
