## Proposals for amendment of Appendices I and II at the 16th Meeting of the Conference of the Parties (CoP16)

A total of 71 proposals have been submitted to the Secretariat of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) for amendment of the Appendices of CITES. These proposals will be discussed at the 16<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Conference of the Parties (COP16) to CITES which will be held in Bangkok, Thailand in March 2013.
