

**AGRICULTURE, FISHERIES AND CONSERVATION DEPARTMENT**  
**Permit Terms for the Importation of Dogs and Cats from Group III Countries/Places**  
**Special Permit Attachment No. 13 (October 2006 Version)**  
**Terms to be complied with fully by the permittee**

1. The permittee must notify the Duty Officer of Import & Export Section during office hours (Tel. (852) 21821001 / Fax. (852) 27698600) at least two working days in advance of the anticipated time of arrival. Failure to do so may result in delay in the inspection and release of the animals.
2. The animals must be transported by the fastest and most direct route from the exporting country/place to or through Hong Kong as MANIFESTED CARGO.
3. The animals must be carried and caged (with labels) in accordance with the current Live Animals Regulations of IATA (International Air Transport Association) and in such a way as to ensure humane management at all times.
4. The Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Ordinance, Cap. 169, the Public Health (Animals & Birds) Ordinance, Cap.139, the Rabies Ordinance Cap. 421, the Dogs and Cats Ordinance Cap. 167 and all other relevant legislation must be fully complied with.
5. Dogs and cats less than 2 months old and/or more than 4 weeks pregnant must not be imported.
6. Fighting dogs as listed in Schedule 1 of the Dangerous Dogs Regulation, Cap.167, such as Pit Bull Terrier, Dogo Argentino, Japanese Tosa and Fila Brasileiro and their crossbreeds must not be imported.
7. The animal is to be identified by a microchip which is listed on the accompanying animal health certificate. If the dogs are identified with a microchip other than that used for the identification of dogs in Hong Kong (AVID encrypted transponder with an alphanumeric code in the format of AVID\*XXX\*XXX\*XXX) then after arrival in Hong Kong the dogs will be rechipped at the expense of the permittee or agent.
8. On arrival, the animals must be accompanied by the following certification in English or Chinese:  
(A separate certificate should be issued for each individual animal.)

(a) Animal Health Certificate	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Dated not more than 14 days before the departure, certifying that the animal is free from any clinical signs of infectious or contagious disease, fit to travel, free of any quarantine restrictions imposed by the government authority of the country/place of export, and is either not pregnant or less than 4 weeks pregnant if it is a female.</li> <li>● The certificate must be positively correlated to the animals being certified by inclusion of the identifying microchip details.</li> </ul>
(b) Anti-rabies Vaccination Certificate (Optional)	The certificate should show a good history of anti-rabies vaccination, if possible.
(c) Vaccination Certificate	<p>Certifying that the animal has been fully vaccinated against the following canine/feline infectious diseases not less than 14 days and not more than 1 year before departure to Hong Kong:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Dogs---Canine Distemper, Infectious Canine Hepatitis and Canine Parvovirus.</li> <li>● Cats----Feline Panleucopaenia (Infectious Enteritis) and Feline Respiratory Disease Complex (Cat Flu).</li> </ul> <p>Animals under 6 months of age must have been vaccinated twice against the above mentioned disease not less than 14 days before coming to Hong Kong.</p>

9. Dogs and cats of 5 months of age or older will be vaccinated against rabies on arrival and again prior to release from quarantine where appropriate; dogs will be licensed and microchipped in accordance with Cap. 421 sub. leg. A ( Rabies Regulation) at the expense of the permittee or agent before release.
10. Whenever the Veterinary Officer considers it necessary, the permittee or his agent must ensure that the animals are promptly examined and treated by a private veterinary surgeon at the expense of the permittee or his agent.
11. In the event of the animals being directed, under official escort, to the AFCD Airport Animal Hostel or the approved Animal Management Centre, the permittee or his agent will be required to provide suitable transport and pay the prescribed accommodation fees. Without prejudice to other terms and conditions of this permit, payment of any fees must be effected before the animals can be released.
12. The animals will normally be subject to 4-months quarantine in an Animal Management Centre in Hong Kong. If considered necessary, the period may be extended.

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# 漁農自然護理署

## 許可證條款 - 適用於從第三組國家/地方入口的貓狗

### 特別許可證附頁第13號(2006年10月版本)

#### 持證人必須完全遵守的許可證條款

1. 持證人必須最少在動物預計運抵時間兩個工作天前的辦公時間內，通知進出口組當值職員（電話 (852) 21821001 / 圖文傳真 (852) 27698600）。否則可能會導致檢驗及放行動物之事受到延誤。
2. 動物必須以大行李（艙單貨運）(Manifested Cargo)方式，以最快捷及最直接的路線由出口國/地方運入或運經香港。
3. 動物如以空運，必須按照國際航空運輸協會(IATA)現行的活生動物規例載運及以附有標籤的籠裝載，以確保其一直獲以人道方式運送。
4. 必須完全遵守香港法例第169章防止殘酷對待動物條例、第139章公眾衛生（動物及禽鳥）條例、第421章狂犬病條例、第167章貓狗條例及所有其他有關的法例。
5. 未足2個月大或懷孕多於4星期的貓狗不准入口。
6. 香港法例第167章危險狗隻規例附表1所列的格鬥狗隻包括比特鬥牛獾、日本土佐犬、阿根廷杜告狗、巴西非拉狗及該四個品種的混種狗隻不准入口。
7. 鑑別該動物用的微型晶片與附同的動物健康證明書上所登記的微型晶片，兩者必須吻合。如植入該狗隻的微型晶片有別於香港所用的型號(AVID加密應答器所顯示的辯識碼格式須由英文字母及數目字組成為AVID\*XXX\*XXX\*XXX)，則該狗隻抵達香港後須另行植入微型晶片，而費用由持證人或其代理支付。
8. 動物在運抵時，必須附同下列用英文或中文書寫的證明書：  
(每頭動物須分別擁有獨立的證明書。)

(a) 動物健康證明書	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 此證明書須在有關動物離境前 14 天內簽發。證明該動物並無傳染或觸染疾病的病徵，其健康狀況許可將之運送至香港，不受出口國/地方政府當局之檢疫限制，且該動物（倘屬雌性）並無懷孕或即懷孕亦不足 4 星期。</li><li>• 證明書上要有該動物詳細的微型晶片資料足以證實該動物的正確身份。</li></ul>
(b) 狂犬病防疫注射證明書	盡可能提供此等動物過往狂犬病防疫注射證明。
(c) 傳染病防疫注射證明書	證明該動物在來港前不少於 14 天亦不多於 1 年已有足夠的免疫注射，以抵抗下列之狗/貓傳染病： <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 狗 -- 犬瘟熱、犬病毒性肝炎及犬病毒性出血腸炎。</li><li>• 貓 -- 貓瘟（貓病毒性腸炎）及綜合性呼吸系統病（貓流行性感冒）。</li></ul> 未足 6 個月大的動物，必須在來港前 14 天便已接受兩次注射預防上述的貓狗傳染病。

9. 狗隻及貓隻已足五個月大在抵港時將會接受狂犬病疫苗注射，有需要時須在離開動物管理中心前再次接受注射；根據香港法例第421章附屬法例A(狂犬病規例) 已足五個月大的狗隻將會植入晶片及領取牌照，而費用由持證人或代理人支付。
10. 倘獸醫官認為有需要，持證人或其代理便須確保有關動物即時由私家獸醫進行檢驗及診治 / 防疫注射，一切費用由持證人或其代理支付。
11. 倘動物須在當局職員護送下送往漁農自然護理署機場動物居留所或認可的動物管理中心，持證人或其代理人便要提供適當的運輸工具和繳付所規定的動物居留費用。在不影響本許可證其他條款的情況下，持證人須先繳付此等費用，動物方會獲放行。
12. 動物通常須在本港認可的動物管理中心接受4個月檢疫。本署如認為有需要，或會將檢疫期延長。
