Country and Marine Parks Authority Progress Report (1.11.2018 – 31.3.2019)

Purpose

This paper aims to provide members a general overview on management and protection work conducted by the Country and Marine Parks Authority during the period between 1.11.2018 – 31.3.2019. It provides various figures and information for facilitating members to understand and offer advice to the Authority regarding the management of country and marine parks.

A. Country Parks & Special Areas

1. Country Parks Management

1.1 Management Services

Routine maintenance of all recreational facilities within county parks and special areas was carried out regularly for public enjoyment. Major country parks facilities provided and amount of refuse collected are shown below for reference.

1.3 Permitted Events

In the reporting period, permissions were given under Reg. 11 of the Country Parks and Special Areas Regulation to hold 455 events in country parks. Most of these events were related to sport competition, location filming and raising funds for charity.

1.4 Control of Development

A total of 56 development proposals were received. There was no objection to 19 of them, the other 36 were being processed and one were cancelled. Most of these were related to minor works concerning electricity supply and slope works.

* Participated in the Clean Shoreline Event organized by Environmental Protection Department **2.5** During the report period, our Marine Parks Ambassador participated in the following volunteer services and training programs: Shui Hau coastal clean-up, Yi O tour, and one Marine Parks Ambassador training workshop was organised. A total of 46 ambassadors joined the above activities.

2.6 Up to 31 March 2019, a total of 141 Marine Parks Ambassadors have completed 20 hours services; 57 Ambassadors have completed 40 hours services; 31 Ambassadors have completed 70 hours services; 22 Ambassadors have completed 100 hours services, 14 Ambassadors have completed 150 hours services and 6 Ambassadors completed 200 hours service. They were awarded with the "Jellyfish Service Badge", "Nautilus Service Badge", "Fiddler Crab Service Badge", "Starfish Service Badge", "Humphead Wrasse Service Badge" and "Chinese White Dolphin Service Badge" respectively. Until the end of March 2019, the accumulated service hours of marine parks ambassadors are 10,589 hours.

3. Law Enforcement

3.1 During the report period, a total of 502 advices and 99 verbal warnings were given to fishermen and visitors and 10 prosecutions were taken against offenders in Marine Parks and Marine Reserve. A total of 16 Joint Anti-illegal Fishing Operations with Marine Police were conducted in Marine Parks.
