# Country and Marine Parks Authority Progress Report (1.9.2023 – 31.12.2023)

# **Purpose**

### 3. Enforcement

The department established the taskforce on sea enforcement work related to the Marine Parks Ordinance (Cap. 476) and Fisheries Protection Ordinance (Cap. 171) to enhance synergistic effect. During the report period, there were 3 illegal fishing cases related to Cap. 171 successfully prosecuted and 2 suspected cases were under investigation. In addition, 8 cases of suspected illegal activities (including 7 fishing-related cases) related to Cap. 476 were under investigation while a total of 67 advice and 5 verbal warnings were given.
