VI. CONTROL OF DEVELOPMENT

A total of 46 development proposals were received. There was no objection to 23 of them, the other 23 were being processed. Most of these were related to minor works concerning electric supply and slope works.

VII. <u>EDUCATION/VISITOR SERVICES</u>

(1) No. of Visits to Visitor Centres

A total of 211,151 persons visited the Country Park Visitor Centres at Sai Kung, Aberdeen, Shing Mun, Clear Water Bay, Tai Mo Shan and Plover Cove; 166,224 persons visited Lions Nature Education Centre and 32,953 persons visited Ngong Ping Nature Centre.

(2) <u>Video Shows of Country Parks</u>

A total of 7,170 video shows on country parks and nature conservation were given, reaching an audience of 33,832. Besides, the "Songs of Nature" were played at various Visitor Centres to promote the voted Best Scenic Sites of Hong Kong.

(3) Guided Tour

A total of 1,339 participants from 36 organizations joined the guided tour at Lions Nature Education Centre; 1,134 participants from 137 groups joined the guided walk at Ngong Ping Nature Centre.

(4) <u>Fixed Point Guided Tour</u>

A total of 10,372 participants from 1,304 organizations joined the Fixed Point Guided Tour at Lions Nature Education Centre. A total of 135 participants from 11 organizations joined the High Island Fixed Point Guided Tour.

(5) Country Park Volunteer Scheme

Starting from March 2010 to March 2011, a total of 202 volunteers joined Country Park Volunteer Training. After 4-day trainings, the volunteers will assist the organization of various nature conservation and education activities of the country parks. The fifth batch of training will be arranged in May 2011.

(6) Geopark Festival

To promote geo-conservation, the department held a series of activities, including a kick-off ceremony, funfair, paper-cutting roadshows and workshops, photo contests and workshops, and a vote for the best geo-tour route during the "Geopark Festival" since 30 October 2010. A total of 90,000 people participated in "Geopark Festival" at the end of March 2011.

(7) <u>Great Outdoors Hong Kong</u>

A total of 6,455 people participated in the "Great Outdoors Hong Kong!" hiking activities organized by the department and Hong Kong Tourism Board.

(8) School Visit Programme 10/11

A school visit programme was launched from November 2010 to June 2011 to convey nature conservation and geoconservation message to students. From December 2010 to March 2011, a total of 2,983 students from 38 kindergartens participated.

(9) Country Parks Reporters Competition

The department organized an inter-school contest called "Country Parks Reporters Competition" in March 2011. A total of 223 students from 20 schools participated.

(10) Country Parks Orienteering Programme

In March 2011, the department organized the "Country Parks Orienteering" programme for students to experience orienteering and to learn about the country parks. A total of 317 students from 8 schools participated.

(11) Hong Kong Tree Planting Day

A total of 1,945 participants planted 10,100 trees in Tai Lam Country Park in the "Hong Kong Tree Planting Day" on 26 March 2011 for better environment.

5. <u>MONITORING</u>

5.1 Water Quality Monitoring

The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology was commissioned to carry out water quality monitoring in marine parks and marine reserve in 2010-11. The results are generally good and in compliance with the Water Quality Objectives. A summary of water quality monitoring from 2004 – March 2011 has been uploaded onto the AFCD's homepage (http://www.afcd.gov.hk/english/country/cou_vis/cou_vis mar/cou_vis mar mon/cou_vis mar mon wat.html).

5.2 Fishing Survey

5.2.1 Fishing survey at Cape D' Aguilar Marine Reserve continued. The objective is to investigate the long-term enhancement effect of the marine reserve on fisheries resources. The recent result showed that the Catch-per-unit-effort and the diversity of fish remain stable inside the marine reserve and is higher than surrounding waters.

5.2.2 Quarterly fishing surveys at Hoi Ha Wan, Yan Chau Tong and Tung Ping Chau Marine Parks had been carried out to monitor the levels of fish stocks in the three marine parks. The Catch-per-unit-effort and the diversity of fish inside the marine parks are generally better than the area immediately outside.

5.3 <u>Dolphin Sightings</u>

Off-effort dolphin sighting were conducted during the course of patrol of Sha Chau and Lung Kwu Chau Marine Park. It was evident that Chinese white dolphins utilize the marine parks and the waters around as usual.

During the report period, Marine Parks Ambassador Scheme provided voluntary service in the following activities: dolphin-watching activity in Sha Chau & Lung Kwu Chau Marine Park, Reef Check 2010 Closing ceremony at City University of Hong Kong, the 16th Ocean Park Conservation Weekend, and preparation meetings for the Ocean Park Conservation weekend, "Hong Kong Marine Wonders — Paper-cutting Competition" closing ceremony at Hong Kong Central Library, coastal cleanup service at Tung Ping Chau Marine Park, and visit to the marine science laboratory, The Chinese University of Hong Kong. A total of 62 Marine Parks Ambassadors had taken part in these activities.

Marine Parks Division has launched "Marine Based Guided Tour – Exploration of fishermen culture, marine and geo-heritage resources in Hong Kong" for secondary schools starting from Oct 2010. During the report period, 90 guided tours with 2,886 participants were held. Furthermore, 4 teacher workshops on the same topic were held with 84 teachers participated.

6.6 Up to 31 Mar 2011, a total of 78 Marine Parks Ambassadors had completed 20 hours services; 29 Ambassadors had completed 40 hours services; 18 Ambassadors had completed 70 hours services; 11 Ambassadors had completed 100 hours services, 4 Ambassadors had completed 150 hours services and 1 Ambassador completed 200 hours service. They were respectively awarded with the "Jellyfish Service Badge", "Nautilus Service Badge", "Fiddler Crab Service Badge", "Starfish Service Badge", "Humphead Wrasse Service Badge" and "Sousa Chinensis Service Badge". Until the end of March 2011, the accumulated service hours of marine parks ambassadors totalled 5,395 hours.
