Frequently Asked Questions

Question 1. What are the opening hours of the Mui Wo Mountain Bike Practice Ground?

Answer 1. There is no limit on opening hours of the Mui Wo Mountain Bike Practice Ground. For safety, users should ride only in daytime, pay attention to the weather condition and select suitable facilities or trails according to their own experience/skills. Children aged 12 or below should be accompanied by leader or adult.

Question 2. Are there any charges for using the facilities of the Mui Wo Mountain Bike Practice Ground?

Answer 2. The facilities in the Mui Wo Mountain Bike Practice Ground are open for members of the public to use free of charge.

Question 3. How can I reach the Mui Wo Mountain Bike Practice Ground?

Answer 3. Members of the public can take ferry, bus or other transportation means to reach the Mui Wo Mountain Bike Trails East Entrance.

Access to the Practice Ground via an emergency vehicular access which is connected to the road leading to Lai Chi Yuen Cemetery is also available.
