

1. General information

The project is set up to help fishermen develop concept of ecotourism and recreational fisheries through fishermen training and practices; and create employment opportunities and provide alternative livelihoods to the fishermen and raise their income.

The project is operated by Environmental Association sponsored by Sustainable Fisheries Development Fund.

2. Significant accounting policies

(a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements of the Project have been prepared in accordance with Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standard issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants, and accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

(b) Income Recognition

Grant income is recognized when the project has met the prescribed milestones and DAFC is satisfied with its progress for the approval of grant.

(c) Expenses

All expenses are recorded in the statement of income and expenditure on accrual basis.

(d) Cash and cash equivalent

Cash and cash equivalents include cash at bank and on hand and short-term, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.
